15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

The institution's vision is to empower female students from rural backgrounds, enabling them to realize their career goals. The curriculum, created by the affiliating university, incorporates a multi-disciplinary and inter-disciplinary approach. The institution aims to provide students with a well-rounded exposure to various subjects and experiences. The college has consistently adopted a multidisciplinary approach in both academics and extracurricular activities. The university structures the curriculum for its affiliated colleges according to UGC regulations. Every program is carefully crafted to ensure students acquire substantial knowledge, even in non-major subjects. The curriculum is complemented by

hands-on learning, which stimulates intellectual curiosity and enhances understanding of the chosen field. The updated syllabi for all programs include components from various disciplines. All university courses are credit-based. The development of both practical and cognitive skills is prioritized through a blend of theoretical and practical instruction. Skill Development Certificate courses are available for students under the "Naan Mudhalvan Scheme." In the near future, students will be encouraged to attend seminars, conferences, and special lectures at the college.

16. Academic bank of credits (ABC):

The curriculum currently followed at Bharathiyar University includes credits for all courses. The ABC regulation encourages a blended learning approach, where students can earn credits from different HEIs registered under the scheme via SWAYAM. Our institution has already begun promoting participation in national educational programs like MOOCS, SWAYAM, and NPTEL for both faculty and students to gain academic credits. A significant focus is placed on internal assessments, which enables faculty to create a variety of assessments and assignments to evaluate students not only on memorization but also on their ability to generate knowledge. Measures are being taken to register under the ABC framework, allowing students to take advantage of multiple entry and exit points in their academic programs. Workshops are being organized for teaching staff to improve their understanding of the Academic Bank of Credit (ABC). These workshops will include subject experts, alumni, university representatives, and industry leaders to ensure the syllabus is in line with current industry requirements. To enrich their educational experience, students have the opportunity to earn additional credits through extracurricular activities like NSS, NCC, sports, and add-on courses.

17. Skill development:

Navarasam Arts and Science College for Women is focused on delivering education that is centered around knowledge, values, and skill development to fulfill its vision. Acknowledging the importance of providing women with the necessary skills for personal and career advancement, NASCW has introduced numerous initiatives to promote comprehensive development and equip students for success in a competitive world. Students are given access to various resources such as library books, scientific journals, e-journals, academic software, e-learning platforms, and open-source programs.

In addition to its standard academic curriculum, the college places strong emphasis on nurturing soft skills, language skills, and life skills. The college offers skill development courses like Data Analytics, which are designed to provide job security for the future. Entrepreneurial courses, such as aari work, allow students to apply their creativity and develop new skills. The college is actively working to introduce new skill development courses under the National Skill Development Corporation. It organizes frequent skill-enhancement workshops, seminars, and guest lectures by industry professionals covering a wide range of topics such as communication, leadership, financial literacy, and digital marketing to prepare students for personal and professional growth. The institution fully recognizes the value of skilling courses, and as skill enhancement is part of its mission, efforts are continuously made to inspire students to expand their skill sets.

Students are informed about the assessment methods and the minimum required scores for course completion. Evaluation for each course is based on various factors like internal tests, attendance, presentations, and class participation, all of which are explained to students at the beginning of each semester. The college provides the necessary physical infrastructure and employs qualified teachers who actively involve students in research-oriented activities, which are vital for the teaching-learning process. Furthermore, students engage in internships as part of the curriculum, providing them with practical experience and exposure to real-world work environments.

20.Distance education/online education:

The institution offers online classes for student teachers and encourages them to enroll in online certificate courses. Students are prompted to register for online certificate programs like NPTEL, SWAYAM, and other similar platforms, with adjustments made to the timetable to accommodate these courses. The introduction of initiatives like SWAYAM, which offers high-quality educational programs, and the promotion of Open Source Software for Education, has proven to be extremely beneficial for both students and faculty, supporting educational and professional usage of open-source software. Students also enrolled in courses from platforms like Coursera, earning extra credits upon successful completion. Online learning was actively promoted, especially during the pandemic, and students were encouraged to take online courses from both domestic and international universities. The college website allows students to access their syllabus, study materials, and submit their assignments.

1. Gender Studies:
